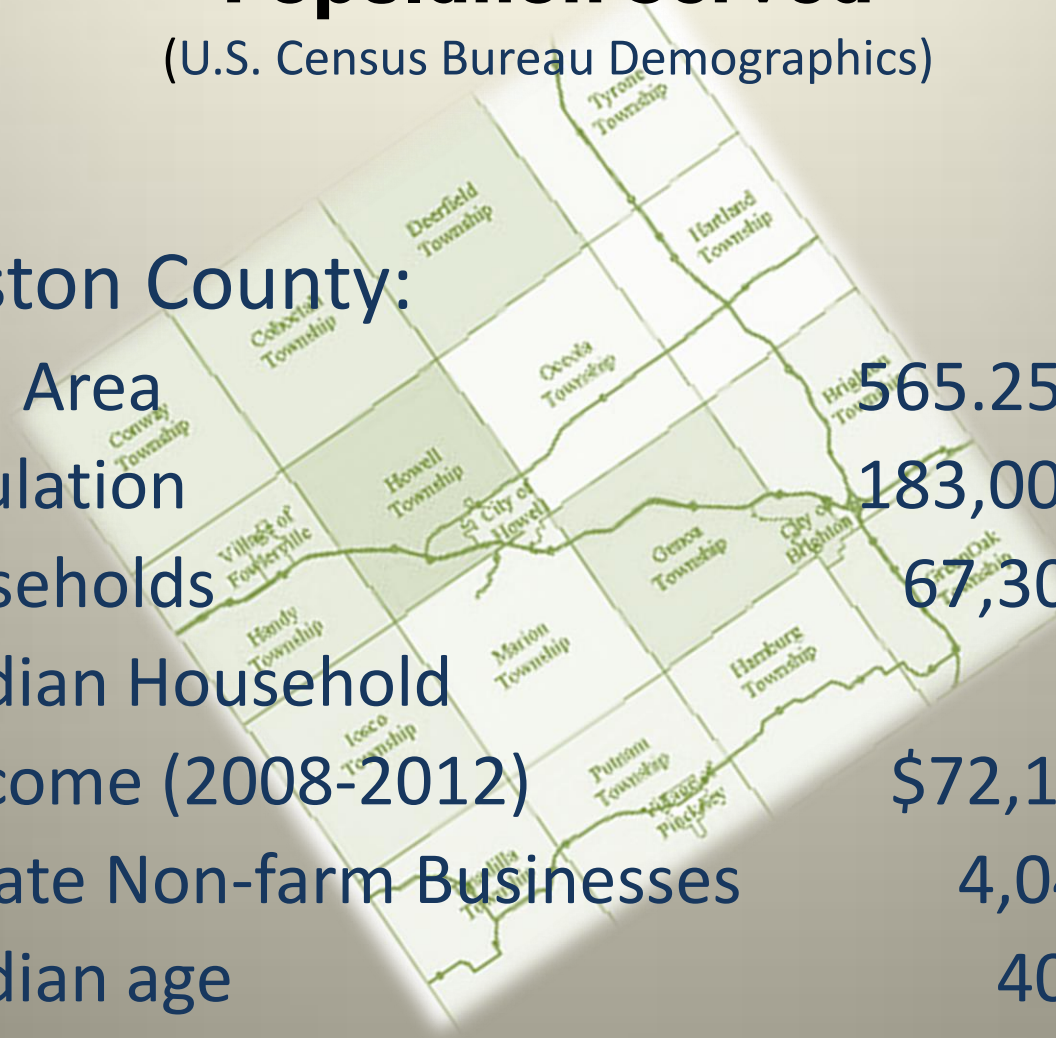

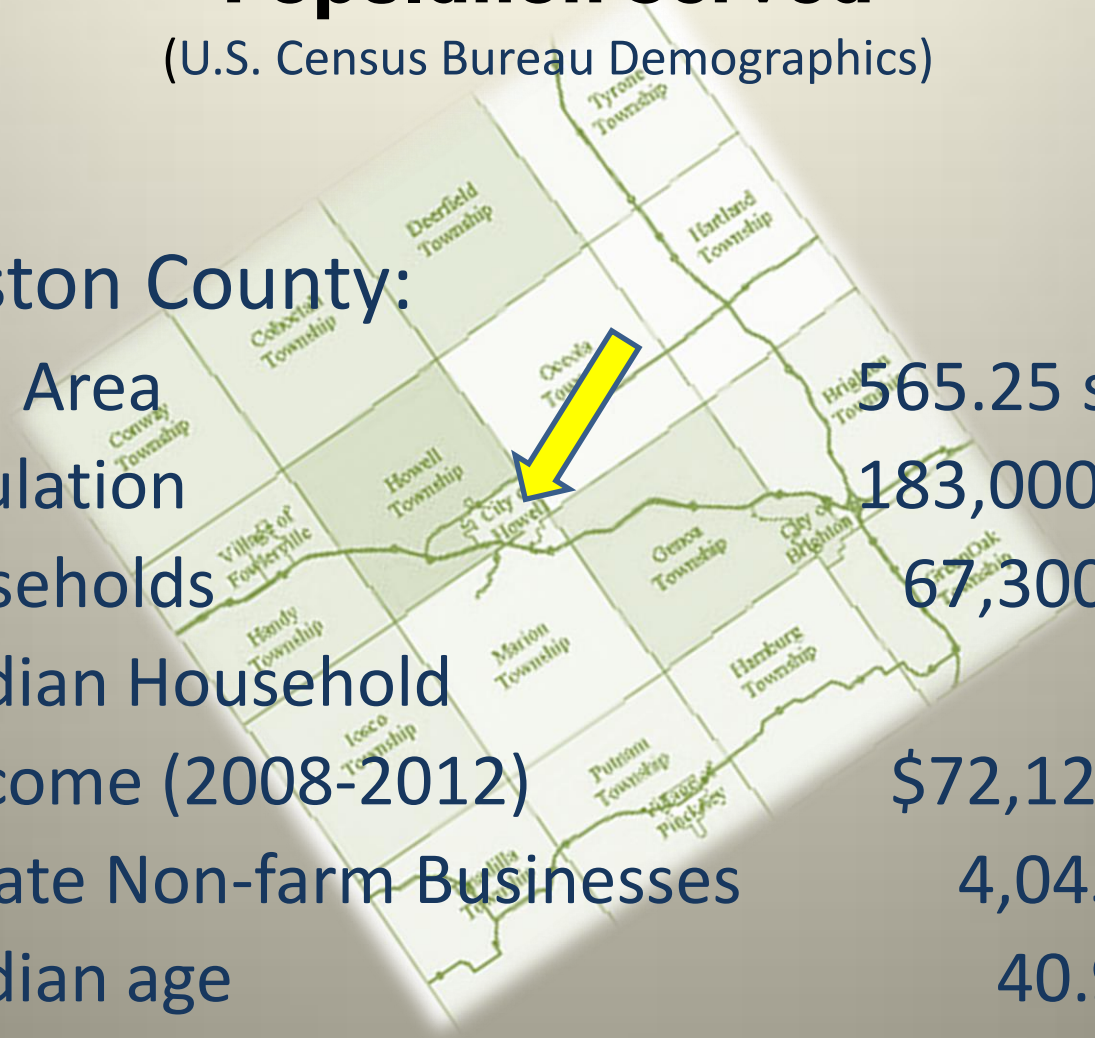

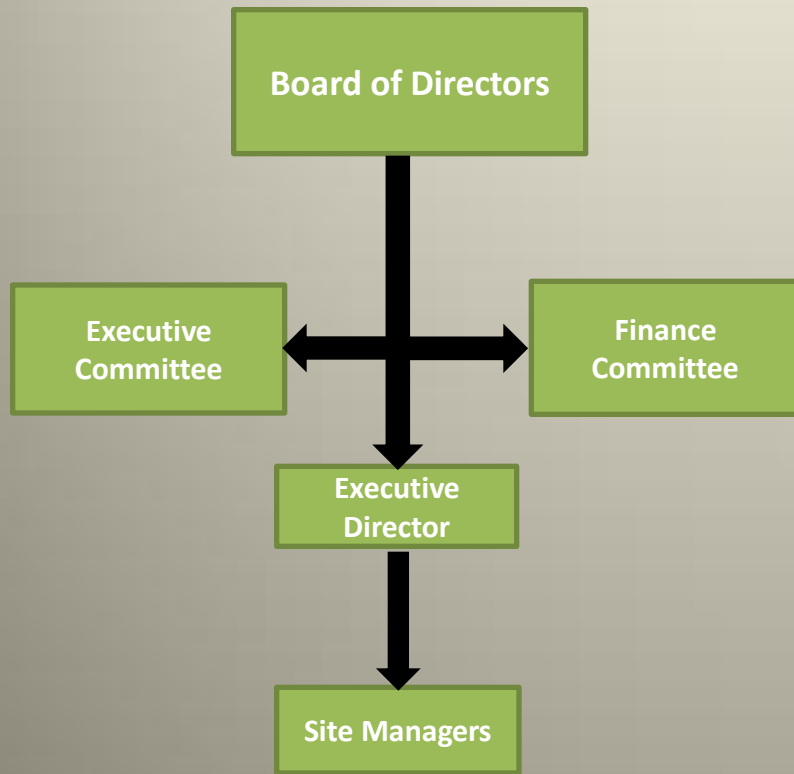

# Recycle Livingston

## Organization



- **Board of Directors**
  - Minimum 7, Maximum 10 Directors
  - Elected Annually by Membership
  - Volunteer Positions
  - Annually Board elects President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer
- **Executive Committee**
  - Four Board Officers plus 1 Director appointed by the Board to address operational needs when full Board is not available
- **Finance Committee**
  - Comprised of the Board President, Vice President and Treasurer and responsible for the development and monitoring of the annual budget
- **Executive Director**
  - Full-time employee responsible for Day to Day Operations
- **Site Managers**
  - Part-time employees responsible for site activities on collection days (Wednesday and Saturday)

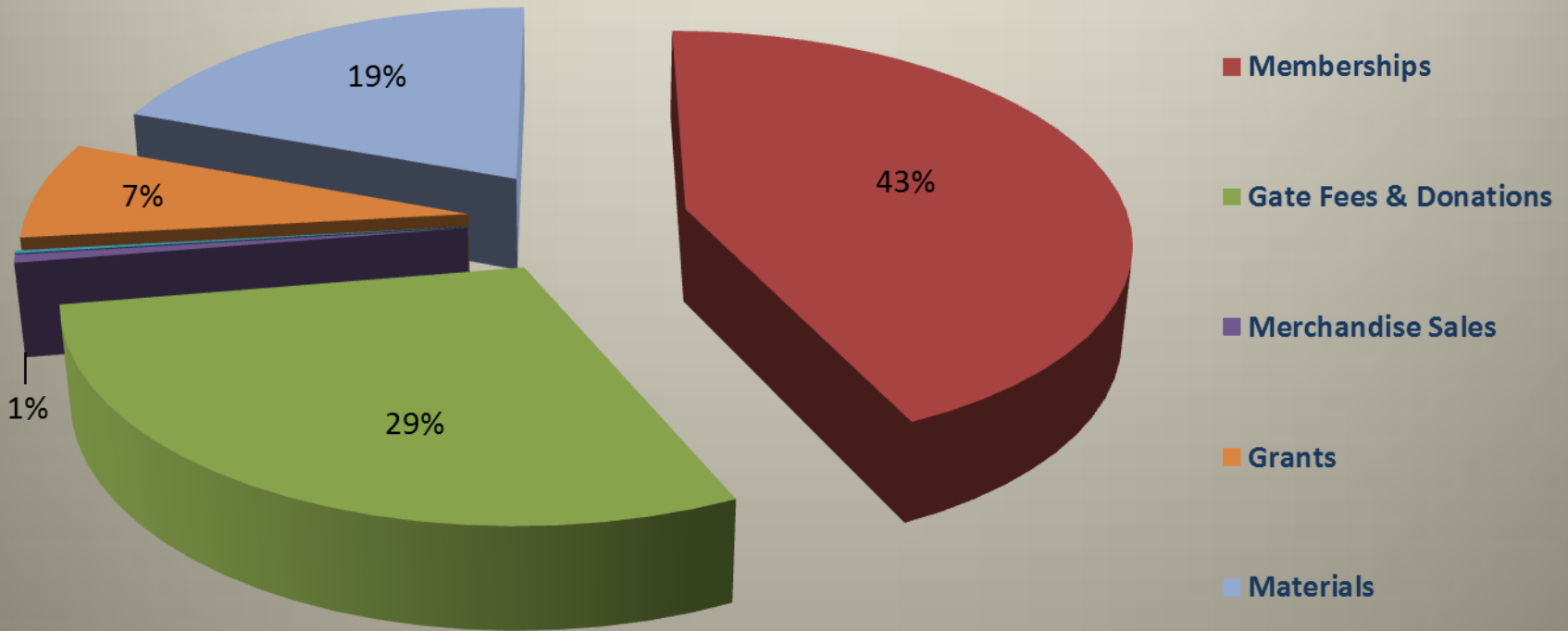
## Annual Membership Levels

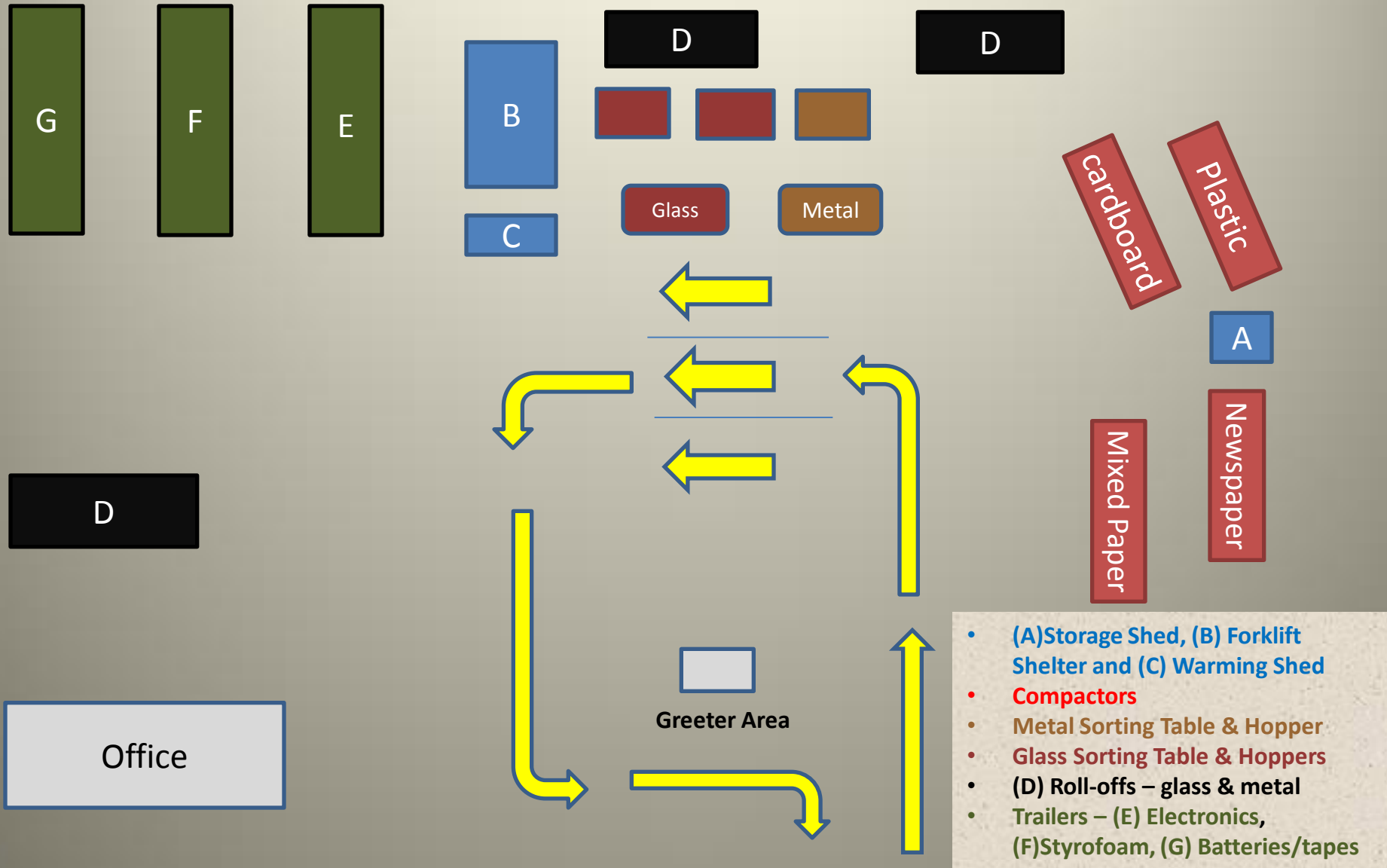
## Source of Funds

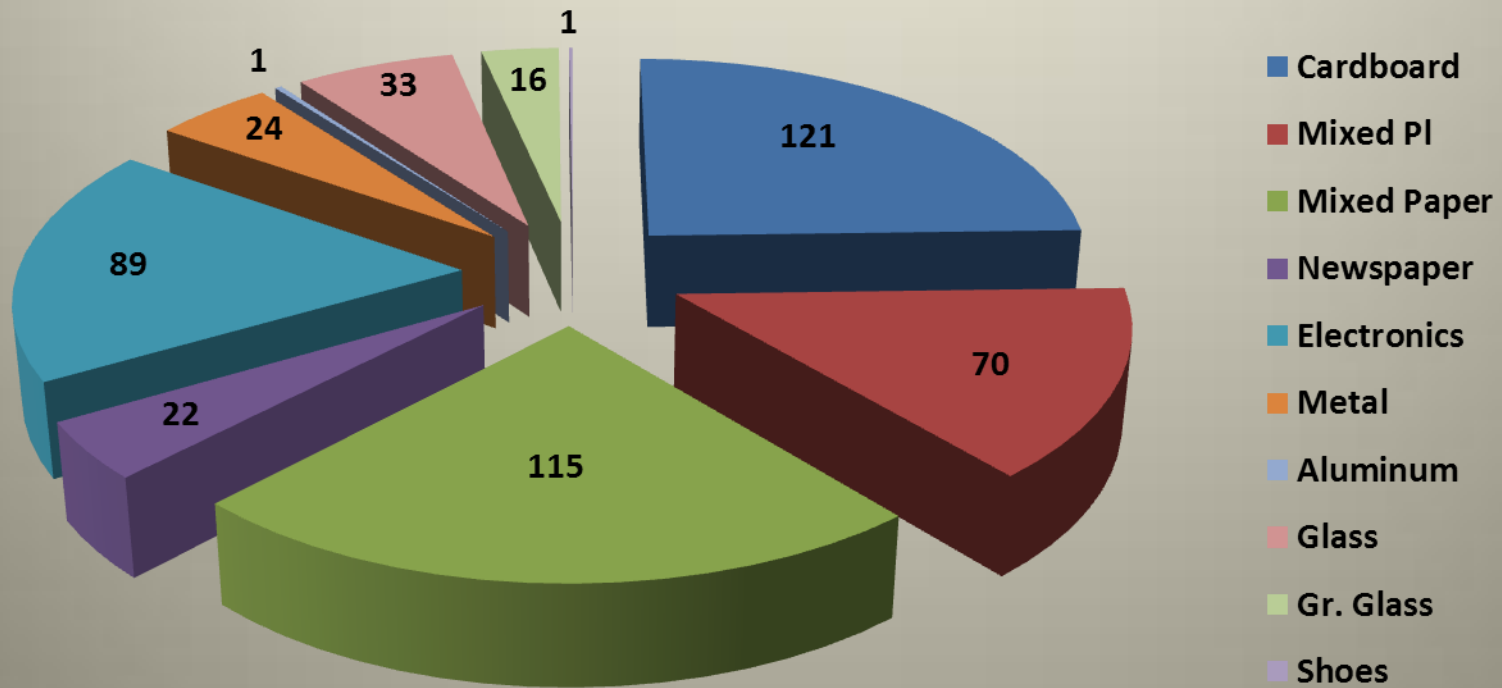
