# RECYCLE **UR BOAT COV**

We invite you to join marinas, boat dealers, & individuals across the state to participate.

### WHY RECYCLE BOAT COVERS?

- For every bag recycled energy, oil, and landfill space is conserved.
- Save money on disposal fees.
- · Looks great on a Clean Marina application or recertification.
- Keeps the Great Lakes clean and waste free.

#### **HOW DO I PARTICIPATE?**

- 1. Buy your EZ Fill Recycle Run bags at http://tinyurl.com/2aa2pmkb The purchase of your recycling bag covers pick-up, haul-away, and processing directly from your location.
- 2. For direct pick-up of your boat covers you must register for a minimum of 15 bags. Locations in the UP must meet a 70 bag minimum.
- 3. Bags are industrial size and can hold covers up to a 32' boat (1 large cover or 1-3 small covers).
- 4. Each bag comes with a zip tie to seal the bag, and recycling instructions.
- 5. Program Coordinators will reach out to schedule a pick-up with your location in June-August.

#### **RECYCLING FOR INDIVIDUAL BOATERS**

- If registering with less than 15 boat covers, you will be required to drop-off bags at a participating drop-off location. Visit our website or join our email list to learn more about Recycle Run drop-offs.
- We ask individuals to bundle bags tightly and keep them dry and clean as they plan for recycling in the spring.









Keep boat covers clean, dry, and condensed. All registrations are due on June 1, 2024.
